Civilian Experts Course
Contents of the Coursework

The Coursework for the Civilian Experts Course will provide practical knowledge and skills through lectures and workshops for approximately 2 weeks. The Coursework is based on participatory problem-solving learning, and is designed to facilitate interactions between lecturers and participants and among participants. For lectures, the participants will receive textbooks in advance and aim for a high-level knowledge of peacebuilding. Through workshops, the participants will learn to apply the acquired knowledge to practice and strive to develop practical peacebuilding skills. All sessions will be conducted in English.

The list of lecturers will be available on the HPC website once approved by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Japan.
